## **Invitation and Procedure to create world record with Delhi Public School and IIT Bombay's Mood Indigo 2020**



IIT Bombay is a public technical and research university located in Powai, Mumbai. The institute is recognized worldwide as a leader in the field of engineering education and research.

Mood Indigo - the annual cultural festival of IIT Bombay, renowned to be Asia's Largest College Cultural Festival - is presently in its 50th edition. With over 240 events ranging from dramatics, dance, and music to glamorous professional concerts, Mood Indigo is widely considered as the hotbed of budding talent and the biggest meeting ground for over 1,46,000 students. This year it is a 2 day - 2-night extravaganza which will take place on 26th -27th December in a full virtual mode. This year we plan to create a world record and your school students will participate in the same.

### **Idea for the record:**

Most number of people making paper cranes together (online): The idea of making paper cranes reference to the famous Japanese Fable about making 1000 paper cranes as a prayer to heal from disease and we'd be making paper cranes as a prayer to heal from Coronavirus.

### **Message from the team:**

Inspired by the story of Sadako and The Thousand Paper Cranes, our aim is to light candles of hope across the nation in difficult times like these. The cranes are our cry, our prayer for those who lost their lives to the pandemic. We will create these cranes in a hope that things will get better and there will be peace and we invite students of Delhi Public School for the same.

**Procedure:**

1. For making the record the students taking part in the record will have to register and the link to the website - [worldrecord.moodi.org](http://worldrecord.moodi.org)
2. Students will be required to register on the website **before 15th December** and the expected event date is **20th December**.
3. The exact time of the event will be announced on the website as well as through mails so keep checking the mails of the IDs which students will provide during registration.
4. On 20th December, the virtual event will take place on the same website for an approx duration of 30 mins. During the event, students will be guided on how to make a paper crane (for making a paper crane a student needs to only have a piece of paper preferably a thin square sheet ( 3x3inch or bigger/an A4 size paper + scissors). We might take snapshots of the students making the paper crane
- 5. The students need to make the paper crane at the time of the event.**
6. After making the paper crane the students will be asked to click a photo of the paper crane they made and upload it on the website.
7. An info booklet will be uploaded on the website on **14th December** in which there would be more instructions about the procedure on the day of the event.

All the students will receive certificates for contributing in an attempt to create a world record.

**Important Dates:**

- 1. 9 December:** Website launch and registration begins
- 2. 14 December:** Procedure cum Info Booklet will be uploaded
- 3. 15 December:** Last date for the student to register on the website.
- 4. 20 December:** Expected date of the event. The exact time of the event will be conveyed soon.

The students need to practice at least thrice making paper cranes before the date of the event. Kindly use this video for practice making a paper crane -
